## Drysdale Manager's Report

The year 2013 experienced many highs and lows - We experienced the death of Margaret Thatcher and the birth of Prince George to proud parents William and Kate, we saw a new Pope chosen (Pope Jorge from Argentina) and terrorist attacks at the Boston marathon, back home we welcomed a new Government and while we lost the Ashes in England, Hawthorn won the AFL premiership. In Banking, interest rates continued to fall causing investors to tighten their belts or look for other investment options and borrowers enjoyed record low rates.

The year has passed quickly but significant achievements have been made by both Portarlington and Drysdale branches.

#### **Annual General Meeting/Grants presentation**

At our Annual General Meeting held on the 19<sup>th</sup> November, 16 groups and organisations were presented with grants ranging from \$1,000 to \$10,000 each. Grants totalled just over \$60,000 and this is another significant boost to the North Bellarine area. The successful recipients of the grants are listed in this newsletter.

As Stephen Wight, **Community Bank**® treasurer reported on the night, since Portarlington opened its doors over 14 years ago, more than \$1.3 million dollars has been given back to the community in the form of shareholder dividends, donations, sponsorships and grants. He also reported that the Board has agreed to continue the fully franked share dividend of 8 cents. This achievement was made possible by the work from our Board of Directors, Branch Manager and extremely dedicated staff.

Our speaker on the night was "Cottage by the Sea" who is a non-government, not-for-profit organisation that empowers disadvantaged children by supporting them in developing their self-esteem, health and well-being. Their vision is that every child deserves a happy and a healthy life. We heard from a child from the North Bellarine who is on this journey with this organization and the achievements he has made.

Our other speakers were 2 participants from the North Bellarine who attended the Youth Summit held this year in Noosa. This **Community Bank**® gave the opportunity to 5 students to attend a summit and learn about self awareness, aiming high in life and building confidence. Many have booked into the 2014 summit which is being held in Melbourne.

#### **Business**

Our business stands, as at 30/11/2013, at \$217M combined and growth last financial year totaled \$17.5M. While not at the same level as previous years, growth in the banking industry with lending and deposits is much more difficult. With low rates in deposits, investors are entering the share market, purchasing an investment property or seeking financial advice on options available. Low rates with lending has been a positive but confidence in job security is driving down consumer confidence and spending. First home owners are missing in action. Combined the branches have a good customer base with more than 9133 accounts.

#### Staff

Our staff involvement with events and donations included:

- Helping at the Portarlington Mussell Festival by selling waffles and the funds raised of \$800 went to Biggest Morning Tea event.
- Selling Entertainment books at the Drysdale branch raising \$275-00 which was donated to the Drysdale CFA.
