### **Notes to the Financial Statements**

### For the Half-Year Ended 31 December 2014

#### NOTE 1. BASIS OF PREPARATION OF HALF-YEAR FINANCIAL REPORT

This financial report covers the Premium Income Fund (the 'Fund') as a single entity for the half-year ended 31 December 2014. The Fund was constituted on 22 December 1999 and is a listed registered managed investment scheme.

The responsible entity of the Fund is Wellington Capital Limited. The responsible entity's registered office is Level 3, 345 Ann Street, Brisbane, Qld, 4000.

This general purpose financial report for the half-year reporting period ended 31 December 2014 has been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standard AASB 134 *Interim Financial Reporting* and the *Corporations Act 2001*.

The interim financial report does not include all notes of the type normally included within the annual financial report. Therefore, this report is to be read in conjunction with the annual report for the year ended 30 June 2014 and any public announcements made during the interim reporting period in accordance with continuous disclosure requirements of the *Corporations Act 2001*.

For the purposes of preparing the half-year financial report, the half-year has been treated as a discrete reporting period. These financial statements cover the Fund as an individual entity. The same accounting policies and methods of computation have been followed in this interim report as were applied in the most recent financial statements.

The Fund is of a kind referred to in ASIC Class Order 98/100 dated 10 July 1998 and in accordance with that Class Order, amounts in the financial report and Directors' Report have been rounded off to the nearest thousand dollars, unless otherwise stated.

The financial report is presented in Australian currency.

#### Segment reporting

Operating segments are reported in a manner consistent with the internal reporting provided to the chief operating decision maker. The chief operating decision maker who is responsible for allocating resources and assessing performance has been identified as the Managing Director of the responsible entity.

### New and revised accounting requirements applicable to the current half-year reporting period

For the half-year reporting period to 31 December 2014, a number of new and revised accounting standards and interpretations requirements became mandatory for the first time, some of which are relevant to the Fund. The adoption of all the new and revised standards and interpretations has not resulted in any changes to the Fund's accounting policies and have had no effect on the amounts reported for the current or comparison half years.

The Fund received 150,025,399 shares in ARL in consideration for the assignment of the charges which were held by Perpetual Nominees Limited as custodian for the Premium Income Fund.
